The incident of burning people alive in West Bengal's Birbhum is horrifying: ABVP

The law-and-order situation in Bengal under the Trinamool Congress government is worrisome

Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad strongly condemns the heart-wrenching incident of burning 10 people alive including, children and women in Birbhum, Bengal. This is not the first instance of the state's law and order situation reaching a critical stage during the reign of Mamata Banerjee as Chief Minister of West Bengal. In the past too, the residents of West Bengal had to face violence on religious and political grounds. After the state assembly elections, TMC cadre with a jihadi mindset unleashed violence on a large population which then had to migrate from many areas.

After the murder of Bhadu Sheikh, the deputy head of Barshal panchayat under Birbhum district, on Monday evening, violence broke out between two groups of Trinamool Congress in the Rampurhat area. After which, there was an arson and in this 10 people including 6 women and 2 children were burnt alive.

National General Secretary of Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad, Nidhi Tripathi said, "At present, the existence of law and order in West Bengal seems to be in danger. The state is becoming a stronghold of anti-social elements. Seeing such a situation, it seems that the barbaric era of Communist rule has once again come to the fore on the soil of Bengal. Burning people alive due to political differences is an act of shame to humanity. We demand a ground-level inquiry in this matter and also urge all sections of the society to stand against such immoral acts."
